GOVERNOR OF TELANGANA INTERACTS WITH IPS OFFICER TRAINEES

The IPS probationers of the 77th RR batch, allotted to Telangana and currently training at the Telangana Police Academy (TGPA), met the Governor of Telangana, His Excellency Shri Jishnu Dev Varma, at Raj Bhavan, Hyderabad, on Saturday (29.11.2025).

The group was accompanied by Smt. Abhilasha Bisht, IPS, DGP & Director, TGPA. The Governor of Telangana Interacts with IPS Officer Trainees in Hyderabad TGPA, who updated the Governor on the training programs, field exposure, and overall readiness of the probationers for their future roles in the State Police service.

During the meeting, the Governor congratulated the probationers for choosing a career dedicated to service and responsibility. He emphasized the crucial role of the Indian Police Service in upholding constitutional values, ensuring public safety, and strengthening democracy.

He wished them all the success and encouraged them to carry out their duties with dedication, fairness, and compassion.



77 RR IPS PROBATIONERS MEETS CHIEF MINISTER OF TELANGANA



Chief Minister of Telangana Sri A. Revanth Reddy outlined a forward looking vision for modern policing during an interaction with IPS Officer trainees of the 77RR batch at the Command and Control Centre in Hyderabad on 27-11-2025.

The Trainee Officers, Ms. Ayasha Fatima, Sri Mandhare Soham Sunil, Ms. Manisha Nehra and Sri Rahul Kant, were accompanied by senior officials, including Director of Telangana Police Academy, Smt. Abhilasha Bisht, IPS.

He stressed the need for police to adapt swiftly to changing crime patterns and public expectations.

He noted that crime has increasingly shifted from physical environments to complex digital platforms, making expertise in cyber-crime, narcotics, economic offences and terrorism investigations essential. He further stated that Hyderabad has become a focal point for these emerging challenges.

He called for specialist training and the expansion of dedicated cybercrime units, urging officers to build competency in digital forensics, malware analysis and cyber investigations. Use of advanced tools, including artificial intelligence and drone technology, was emphasised as vital in countering high-tech criminal networks.

The CM also highlighted the growing importance of disaster preparedness and crowd management, citing large scale events such as Medaram Jatara and Godavari Pushkaralu.

He recommended collaboration with teams experienced in nation-wide events like the Maha Kumbh Mela to improve response capabilities.

Calling language a key asset in policing, he encouraged them to develop fluency in Telugu to strengthen public interaction and build grassroots trust. Cultural awareness and people-friendly policing were described as essential components of effective law enforcement.



He urged the trainees to uphold ethical conduct, transparency and swift citizen response.

DGP Shivadhar Reddy Flags Off Telangana's Largest DSP Probationary Batch Urges officers to uphold the State Police's top national standing

The Director General of Police of Telangana Sri B. Shivadhar Reddy IPS, inaugurated the Induction Training Programme for Probationary Deputy Superintendents of Police at the RBVRR Telangana Police Academy on 06-11-2025.

Addressing the gathering, the DGP said that Telangana Police has earned the distinction of being the top police force in the country and urged the new probationary officers to take the responsibility of maintaining that stature.

Calling it the largest ever batch of 112 probationary DSPs, including 38 women officers, the DGP said their 10-month training at the Academy would lay the foundation for their leadership journey. He said that this campus will instill discipline, punctuality, and a transformative outlook that will define their careers. He further reminded the young officers that a police officer's duty went beyond enforcing the law. He also said that they must understand the spirit of the law. Impartiality, patience, and empathy are the true hallmarks of a good officer. He reminded the Trainee Officers that people see you not just as authorities, but as representatives of justice.

The DGP emphasised that discipline is not punishment but shall be seen as preparedness. He said that each drill, exercise, and collective effort strengthens their self-control, urging them to learn service before leadership.

Highlighting Telangana Police's innovations, he cited site units such Greyhounds, Octopus, CI Cell, TGCSB, and EAGLE, and initiatives like the Command Control Centre, SHE Teams, Bharosa Centres, and Community programmes as examples of how the force has become a national model in modern policing.

He stated that it is a matter of pride that 38 women Officers are part of this batch. Stressing that equality and respect should begin here. "Leadership does not start with authority, it starts with integrity, empathy, and respect towards colleagues," he added.

Reiterating the Department's motto, he said that we have earned the trust of Telangana's people through our service. He added that every time you wear the uniform, let that trust reflect in your conduct. He urged the Trainee Officers to uphold three core values-integrity, empathy, and professional competence. He recalled the Real power does not come from the stars on your shoulders, but from the trust in people's eyes.

Concluding his address, the DGP advised "Let your training make you officers who earn respect through duty, lead with honesty, and protect with compassion. The DGP has also released the training syllabus, while probationers shared their experiences.

INAUGURATION OF 4 WEEKS DISTRICT PRACTICAL TRAINING FOR 77 RR IPS PROBATIONERS

IPS 77th RR Probationers begin District Practical Training. TGPA conducts the core State Orientation Module. The four IPS Officer Trainees of the 77th Regular Recruit Batch allotted to the Telangana cadre commenced their District Practical Training (DPT) on 24 November 2025, immediately after completing their Phase-I course at SVPNPA. The 29-week programme provides a smooth transition from academy instruction to hands-on policing in the State.

A major component of their training is conducted at the RBVRR Telangana Police Academy (TGPA), which serves as the first and most structured introduction to policing in Telangana. During their attachment at TGPA, the probationers receive comprehensive briefings on the Telangana Police organisational framework, State priorities, law and order strategies, crime investigation systems, and technology-driven policing initiatives.

The trainees called on Hon'ble Governor, Chief Minister and Chief Secretary, also interacted with senior officers and visit State-level units including Intelligence, CID, OCTOPUS, Greyhounds, Special Branch, Traffic, SHE Teams, and Bharosa Centres, gaining valuable insight into specialised functions and flagship initiatives for women and child safety.

TGPA further orients the officer trainees on ethical policing, leadership skills, communication, community engagement, cybercrime trends, and digital evidence handling, supported by expert lectures and field demonstrations. This foundation equips them for the next stages of their DPT—district attachment, supervised police station charge, and judicial/armed reserve exposure. “TGPA is proud to contribute to shaping the professional calibre of the 77th RR IPS Probationers, preparing them for responsible and citizen-centric policing in Telangana.

IN-SERVICE COURSES



Course on National Automated Fingerprint Identification System (NAFIS) and Criminal Procedure (Identification) Act (CrPI) conducted from 18.11.2025 to 22.11.2025

NAFIS and CPI Act importance:

1. NAFIS provides a national fingerprint database enabling fast and accurate identification of criminals across States.
2. It strengthens crime scene investigation by quickly matching chance fingerprints and linking serial offenders.
3. The Criminal Procedure (Identification) Act, 2022 legally allows collection of modern biometric and scientific measurements.
4. It improves investigation quality, supports stronger evidence in courts, and enhances conviction rates.
5. Together, both systems modernize policing and make identification, detection, and crime analysis more efficient and scientific.



Mandatory course on Essential Law for Police Officers conducted from 21.10.2025 to 01.11.2025



The Mandatory Course on Cyber Crime Investigation & Digital Forensics, held at RBVRR Telangana Police Academy, Himayat Sagar, Hyderabad, from November 17-29, 2025, trained directly recruited and converted Sub-Inspectors.

Key sessions covered online frauds, social media offences, data preservation, malware analysis with hands-on practical's, and CDR/IPDR/PCAP analysis. Topics also included recent digital arrest cases, VoIP call investigations, cyber risk management, and roles of RBI, NPCI, and banks in probes. The 12-day schedule incorporated new investigative bots, group discussions and expert discussions. Officers of the rank Sub-Inspectors gained practical skills for evidence collection, stakeholder coordination, and effective cyber evidence presentation in trials.



Course on NDPS Cases conducted from 28.10.2025 to 01.11.2025

One Day Workshop on "Sensitization on New Additions in the Bharatiya Nyaya Sanhita - 2023 conducted online Mode:

In November 2025, the Telangana Police Academy conducted four online courses on the New Criminal Laws for in-service police officers across the State. A total of 612 Police officers from constable to Inspector were attended the training. These courses were designed to enhance officers' understanding of the New Criminal Laws and to strengthen their professional competence in applying the correct legal sections while registering cases, collecting evidence systematically, and following proper procedures during investigations.

The Telangana Police Academy has been designated as the Nodal Agency for this initiative by the Chief Office. In this capacity, the Academy has been diligently carrying out the responsibility of training the police personnel effectively.
